UEHRD leads preparation to receive displaced persons in Rakhine State

Naypyitaw, January 11

The Union Enterprise for humanitarian Assistance, Resettlement and Development in Rakhine (UEHRD) is leading the process of accepting and resettling persons displaced by terrorist activities and development works and has prepared three repatriation and assessment camps to resettle ethnic nationals, hindus and muslims.

Authorities have started the land work to construct buildings that will accommodate refugees repatriated from Bangladesh in Hlaphoekhaung Village in Maungtaw District on 11 January.

The following extracts are interviews conducted with local teachers in Maungtaw—

- This meeting with local teachers aims at giving them the power of motivation and lifting their spirits, which can promote their teaching profession. Regarding this meeting, we are going to submit a report to Union-level authorities and coordinate with the Ministry for Education on how to fulfil their requirements.



- Cooperation is essential for the students, their parents as well as the authorities, in order to promote the standard of education in the region. Local teachers would be appreciative if the authorities arranged an appropriate transportation system, especially school buses, to the schools in Maungtau.
- This region suffers a shortage of qualified teachers due to the conflicts and violence. As a result, the ratio of teachers to students is imbalanced. The authorities concerned could be able to fulfil the basic needs of the region and handle these problems through the Hluttaw and the government.
- In former times, teachers couldn't concentrate on their teaching due to the conflicts and violence. Time will heal their mental pains and wounds. In order to feel confident and mentally well, the authorities should cure them as quickly as they can.
