The United Nations Security Council held a briefing session regarding the situation in Myanmar at its Chamber in New York on 13 February 2018. Myanmar Permanent Representative/Ambassador to the United Nations delivered a Statement at the Security Council on the Government's efforts in Rakhine State.

"The current humanitarian crisis is the consequence of terrorist attacks against security posts. It was a clear present threat to the security, sovereignty and territorial integrity of Myanmar. It is not a religious issue as some people are trying to portray. The majority of Muslims living in other parts across Myanmar have been living peacefully and in harmony with other people of different faiths throughout history."

"The challenges facing Rakhine State has no easy quick fix. Ultimately, it is up to the people of Myanmar to determine how to achieve a peaceful and prosperous Rakhine State."

Mothers, children in Sittway receive cash assistance for nutrition

Under a programme to help pregnant women and children under 2 years of age, expecting mothers, toddlers and babies in Sittway and at the Thakkepyin IDP camp received cash assistance on 14 February.

The programme is aimed at providing nutrition to children within 1,000 days after birth.

The cash was presented to mothers and their children on 14 February by Union Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Dr. Win Myat Aye and local authorities.

More than 8,000 mothers and children are eligible to receive the cash assistance under the programme, which is being carried out in Chin State, Rakhine State and the Naga Self-administered Zone.
