Rakhine State Government receives UN's Deputy Emergency Relief Coordinator Sittway, April 4

The Rakhine State Government received the delegation led by Ms. Ursula Mueller, Assistant Secretary General for Humanitarian Affairs and Deputy Emergency Relief Coordinator of the Union Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) at the State Government assembly hall on 4 April.

During the meeting, matters relating to providing humanitarian assistance, implementing the recommendations of the Advisory Commission on Rakhine State, the Rakhine State socio-economic development programme, international organisations freely providing assistance in the state, freedom of travel and health care services, preparations for receiving returnees and arrangements for their resettlement were discussed.

The delegation went to Thatkeyyin relief camp, Dahpine relief camp, AungMingalar Ward and Mingan Ward in Sittway Township where they met with ethnic Rakhine nationals and Muslims.

Maungtaw residents to begin farming with gov't help

The delegation led by Deputy Minister for the Office of the State Counsellor U KhinMaung Tin and the Deputy Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement U SoeAungmet with locals from Maungtaw and Buthidaungat the Maungtaw District General Administration Department on 4 April.

At the meeting, the deputy ministers said the government would provide assistance to the local people in the form of job creation in fields, all communities of Muslims, Hindus and Rakhinewould need to cooperate with the government for the development, security and peace of the Maungtaw District, the religious leaders in the area need to advise their followers not to leave for the neighbouring country.

The delegation visited HlaPhoeKhaung Transit Centre, Kaigy, Mawrawady, Udaung, Thatakonbaung, Shwebaho and met with Rakhine and Mro ethnic people. The Yangon Government constructed 56 houses and Bago Region Government built 64 houses for local Mro ethnic people from Kaigy in Maungtaw.
