Union Minister Dr. Win Myat Aye inspects Maungtaw District Sittway, April 18

The delegation led by Dr. Win Myat Aye, the Chairman of the Committee for Implementing Recommendations on Rakhine State and Union Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement met with 35 Mro and Daing Net families from Bangladesh and assisted in providing accommodation to them at Thitonna Gwason Village in Maungtaw Township, Rakhine State on 18 April 2018.

The delegation then inspected not only the progress of construction of housing for the Mro ethnic people and for their resettlement at the village but also the progress of construction of houses by the Daw Khin Kyi Foundation and Ministry of Border Affairs in Khontaing Village. Afterwards, the delegation visited Ngakhuya Village where a fire outbreak happened on 12 April to inspect a temporary settlement for the fire victims and inspected the Ngakhuya Reception Centre. They also visited the Hla Phoe Khaung Transit Centre to inspect its readiness for repatriation and progress in completing the remaining houses for returnees.

The delegation met with a five-member family, which had recently returned from Bangladesh at the Maungtaw District General Administration Department and provided cash assistance to them.

Union Minister and party visited the Khaungdokkar camp for displaced persons and held a meeting with officials of the camp, the Rakhine State Cabinet and departmental officials relating to the closing of the camps for IDPs (Internally Displaced Persons), which were opened in 2012, to the raising awareness about the benefits of holding National Verification Cards in the state, to the promoting efforts for better education, resettlement, livelihood and farming for NV card holders in the state, and to the implementation of projects funded by the Indian government amounting to US\$5 million annually for five years.
