### **Myanmar, UN agencies initial MoU on assistance for repatriation process of displaced persons from Rakhine State**

Naypyitaw, June 1

The Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) initialed a Memorandum of Understanding on 31 May 2018 at the Ministry of the Office of the State Counsellor in Nay Pyi Taw, to assist the government of Myanmar in implementing the "Arrangement on the Return of Displaced Persons from Rakhine State", an agreement between the governments of Myanmar and Bangladesh signed on 23 November, 2017.

The MoU was initialed by Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population U Aye Lwin, UNHCR Representative Mr. Giuseppe de Vincentiis and Deputy Director of the UNDP Ms. Dawn Del Rio in the presence of Union Ministers U Kyaw Tint Swe, U Thein Swe and U Kyaw Tin.

## **Rakhine Chief Minister inspects Maungtau and Buthidaung**

Maungtau, June 3

Rakhine State Chief Minister U Nyi Pu, accompanied by state ministers and state-level officials went to Buthidaung township on 2 June and 3 June in order to inspect the Maungtau regions' security and development works.

Rakhine State Chief Minister and party inspected a relief camp where Hindus are staying and enquired about the status of health, education and living conditions in Maungtau on 2 June. The State Chief Minister and party also inspected Hla Phoe Khaung Transit Centre.

Rakhine State Chief Minister U Nyi Pu met with ward/village administrators and local residents in Buthidaung on 3 June, inviting constructive suggestions on the socio-economic development, peace and stability and the rule of law in the state. He also stressed the need to develop infrastructure for the health, education and farming sectors for regional progress and discussed important matters such as national reconciliation and internal peace, as only regional peace could bring regional development.
