### **Dr. Win Myat Aye travels to Hla Pho Khaung transit centre**

Sittway, May 29

Union Minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement Dr. Win Myat Aye visited the Hla Pho Khaung transit centre to meet returnees who had returned home voluntarily in Maungtau Township on 29 May.

Union Minister told the returnees that the repatriation process would be carried out systematically, in accordance with the agreements made between Myanmar and Bangladesh. Returnees who initially had homes in Myanmar would be sent back to their homes swiftly and those whose houses were burnt down would have a house built in their original place or somewhere close. The returnees must abide by the nation's law and learn to communicate effectively in Myanmar, which would help build mutual understanding among the people.

All the returnees have voluntarily applied for citizenship and the first step was getting a national verification card (NVC), said Union Minister. He added that everyone must cooperate for the present and long-term benefits, and opportunities for education, healthcare, and employment would be within their reach soon.

Later, Chief Minister U Nyi Puspoke spoke about the job opportunities and resettling processes. He told the returnees to tell out openly and asked them not to do anything without notifying the officials at the transit centre. He added that the authorities were working for the returnees to contact their remaining family members in Bangladesh.

The union minister and his delegation then verified the information provided by the returnees, listened to them and helped them solve difficulties at the transit centre, and provided them with support for the required administration tasks.
