Vice Senior General Soe Win receives Independent Commission of Enquiry

Vice-Senior General Soe Win received the Independent Commission of Enquiry yesterday at the Bayintnaung Guest House in Nay Pyi Taw.

During the meeting, Vice-Senior General Soe Win first explained the commission about the background of Rakhine issue to be able to find out the truth. He has offered the Tatmadaw's full cooperation with the commission, saying that the Tatmadaw distributed evidences related true situation of Rakhine issue to diplomats including diplomats from the United Nations Security Council who met with the Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services Senior General Min Aung Hlaing on 30 April, 2018 and media in timely manner but the international communities remain lack of understanding the true situation.

Mrs. Rosario Manalo discussed the commission's commitment to making correct solution based on evidences and to present the truth to the international communities.
